Report for Brightling and Dallington Parish Councils Planting of Black Poplars in the Parishes, Spring 2020

Background

In late spring 2019 the two parishes of Brightling and Dallington were gifted 10 saplings of the now rare native tree species *Populus nigra ssp betulifolia* (Black Poplar) by a generous Brightling parishioner.

The species is dioecious, male and female flowers are on different plants, and is one of the rarest trees in Great Britain and Ireland with only about 7,000 trees known of which only some 600 have been confirmed as female.

From consultation with the two parish councils it was felt that planting these long-lived and special trees would enhance the natural environment of the parishes and be of benefit to future generations.

It was too late in the year to find permanent planting locations for these 10 saplings and so they were heeled-in (6 in Brightling and 4 in Dallington) to preserve them for the next planting season. By autumn 2019 one of the Dallington saplings had succumbed to the very dry conditions of that summer.

During the autumn of 2019 I became aware of a project at Wakehurst Place, a Kew Gardens outstation, to raise clones of the 38 remaining mature black poplar trees in Sussex (made up of just 5 genetic clones; 3 males and 2 females) and make them freely available for organisations and landowners to plant in suitable locations.

Planting-out, Spring 2020

In January Wakehurst Place kindly provided 18 saplings (representing all 5 genetic clones) labelled with information about the clone number and the location of the specific mature donor tree. Unfortunately, three of the plants had already lost their labels and so their genetic provenance is unknown.

Following appeals posted on the parish websites a total of 9 landowners across the two parishes came forward to offer planting locations. After visiting each site to assess its suitability I worked with the individual landowners and volunteers from both parishes (thanks to Andrew Wedmore and Daniel Lambert-Gorwyn from Brightling and Peter Robotham from Dallington for their assistance) to prepare the sites, plant and stake the 27 saplings, protect each one from rabbits and deer, and mulch to supress weed and grass growth.

All the materials for planting and protection were sourced by me and I was reimbursed at cost for materials used.

Black Poplar saplings are particularly sensitive to drought (the loss of one of the original saplings during the 2019 summer is testament to this) and after one of the wettest winters on record the weather changed in mid-Spring 2020 to dry and sunny. The landowners have been contacted to ask them to keep an eye on their trees and ensure they remain well-watered.

On a following page is a table with the full details of the plants and their locations for the parish records. An explanation of the fields in the table is given below.

The first two digits are the place of origin and the following letter is the gender; 10 = Hastings (Male), 13 = Rushlake Green (Female), 18 = Ripe (Male), 31 = Robertsbridge (Female), 35 = Lower Horsebridge, Hailsham (Male), 36 = also Lower Horsebridge, Hailsham (Male), and the last two

digits are the clone number (set by Wakehurst place)

are coded WUa through WUb

The 9 surviving plants donated in 2019 with unknown provenance are

coded 2019Ua through 2019Ui
